Tragically our beautiful planet is facing a future of mass extinction, declining health and unimaginable climate-disaster. Between 2030 and 2050, according to the <u>World Health</u> <u>Organisation</u>, climate change is expected to cause approximately 250, 000 additional deaths per year from malnutrition, malaria, diarrhoea and heat stress alone.

More frequent and intense extreme weather events **are** having an increasingly dangerous impact in every region of the world, the time we have left to reverse climate change is very little.

<u>The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change</u> (IPCC) warns (2023) that humanity is on the brink. The Secretary General of the United Nations, the UN Security Council and the World Economic Forum have identified climate change as the <u>number one threat facing human</u> <u>security</u>, overshadowing other economic, geopolitical, technological or social factors.

<u>Record temperatures</u> have been recorded in many countries, including Australia, Canada, India, Italy, Oman, Türkiye, Pakistan and the UK. It is <u>virtually certain</u> that the year 2023 will rank among the 10-warmest years on record.

Wildfires, storms and droughts are leading to forced migration and civil conflicts. By 2050 the number of climate migrants may reach 200 million people, mainly children and the poor. <u>Multiple European governments</u> are already warning of critical water shortages after Europe's driest summer for 500 years, followed by a severe winter drought. Today half the global population faces <u>water insecurity</u> at least once a year.

Humanity's "lifeblood" -- water -- is increasingly at risk around the world due to "vampiric overconsumption and overdevelopment," the <u>United Nations (2023)</u> warns.

<u>Adverse health effect</u>s of climate change include respiratory and allergic diseases; vectorborne, food-borne, and waterborne diseases; undernutrition and mental disorders.

Oh Lord, our Earth is in the greatest of danger. There is so much pollution of the air, the water, so much destruction of your beautiful creation, the trees and forests that hold so many gifts, the incredible species of bird and animal, insect and fish, lost or near extinction. Please Lord, open up our hearts and minds to love our planet and all creation, to tenderly care for every living and inanimate thing the way you tenderly care for us all.

It has been estimated that extreme weather increases by more than five times the risk of violent armed conflict within <u>countries</u>, contributing even more to climate change, in multiple ways harming the biosphere.

War causes a widespread loss of life, extensively harms the natural environment, devastates biodiversity and directly contributes to the climate crisis. War impacts wildlife and damages important eco systems.

An estimated 6% of all greenhouse gas emissions are caused by the world's militaries.

Oh Lord, may we never stop learning to love your creation. May we keep growing throughout our lives, reflecting on the meaning of the Word of God in our own lives. Help us to respect others, known and unknown. Let us develop a deep respect for life itself and learn to develop new policies and approaches that do not do harm.

Comfort all of nature in its great need, protect it, heal it, save it, help us to honour it and take care of it, as is Your Will.

According to <u>NASA</u>, Antarctica is losing ice mass (melting) at an average rate of about 150 billion tons per year, and Greenland is losing about 270 billion tons per year, massively adding to sea level rises around the world.

<u>Thwaites Glacie</u>r, the so called "end-of-the-world glacier" in Antartica is crumbling faster than we can act to prevent it. Its collapse would cause the world's waters to rise about 65 centimeters, which would be a catastrophic scenario for coastal cities, wildlife and marine life.

In recent years the ice sheet of the Artic has become about 40 percent thinner and its area has shrunk by 14 percent. The world's major mountain ranges are also losing ice and snow.

It has been <u>calculated</u> that more than 170 trillion plastic particles pollute the oceans and even the glaciers. That quantity is set to more than double from 2016 to 2040. Marine plastic pollution directly contributes to climate change through green house gas emissions, as it breaks down into <u>micro plastics</u>. It also negatively affecting sea life such as plankton. Shockingly only 9% of global plastics are currently recycled, the rest is simply dumped. Meantime <u>4% of the world's</u> annual petroleum production is diverted to making plastic, and another 4% gets burned in the refining process.

It has been <u>reported</u> that in 2022, 1000 "super emitter sites" released gas methane into the global atmosphere at a rate equivalent to 67m running cars. In addition, apparently there are 55 "methane bombs" around the world with the potential to release methane equivalent to 30 years of all US greenhouse gas emissions.

Lord, the earth and its creatures are hurting. The ice caps are melting. The species are dying. The butterflies and birds and insects are diminishing, we are poisoning our waterways and the very air we breathe. How can this be? Lord guide us to a better future. Take away all fear. Open our hearts and minds to take right action now to restore all that us is lost before it is too late. We beg for Your Love and Mercy in our lives and those of future generations. We trust in your wisdom and guidance.

Help us bear witness to the harm being done to the planet so that we can aim to love and restore it once again, right now.

Vast areas of the world's forests have been destroyed. Six thousand years ago the Sahara was a tropical jungle, however overgrazing by humans and the use of fire for land clearance most likely contributed to the loss of vegetation that led to <u>desertification</u>. We do not seem to have learned the lessons of history. Forests create their own weather systems. Destroying them can result in deserts. In the UK there are at least 800 woods that are currently under threat, placing the UK potentially in a <u>state of deforestation</u>. At COP 26 in 2021 more than 100 world leaders promised to end and reverse deforestation by 2030, however a previous deal in 2014

failed to <u>slow deforestation</u>. There needs to be a replanting plan that includes taking care of and ensuring growth of the much needed newly planted trees.

Shockingly least 70% of the clearing of forested areas for agriculture globally, between 2013 and 2019 was done in violation of national laws.

In recent times the world has lost an area of forest twice the size of the United States. Deforestation, according to <u>Scientific American</u>, is adding more carbon dioxide to the atmosphere than the sum total of all the cars and trucks on the world's roads.

Surprisingly, Britain is now one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world. One in every five plant species in the UK is currently listed as <u>threatened</u>. 41% of all Britain's species have declined <u>since the 1970s</u>, more than a quarter of Britain's mammals are at risk of extinction and the number of farmland birds has declined by half. Concerning loss of biodiversity, Britain is in the <u>bottoms 10% of all countries worldwide</u>.

Oh Lord, the needs of the planet our mighty. The forests have been destroyed, the climate is changing, wreaking havoc. Meanwhile we seem to move toward a terrifying future with our eyes closed or feeling helpless and too overwhelmed by the vastness of the reality to know how to act and what to do. Help us to see how we can each make a small difference in creating healing in our environments and communities.



Fill us with confidence that we might dare to hope for a better, more balanced, cleaner, fresh environment, teaming with life as you made it to be, free from fear and destruction.

Climate change is currently the most serious threat to life on our planet. However there are plenty of well understood solutions, as outlined in the In 2015 Paris agreement. Core to that agreement is reducing greenhouse gas emissions to zero as soon as possible. If we stopped emitting greenhouse gases today, the rise in global temperatures would begin to flatten within a few years, but would still <u>remain well-elevated</u> for many, many centuries.

Despite the urgency, however, oil and gas corporations continue to carry on drilling for and burning fossil fuels, <u>while banks, car and energy companies</u> particularly, continue to make vast profits from fossil fuel, endangering the future of our planet.

Give us the strength to face the future and change its outcome to a more peaceful, harmonious, protected, balanced world where we honour nature and recognise our part in its demise and destruction.
